## Appendix 3: What if the Patient Does NOT Meet ACBS Criteria?

If the patient doesn't meet ACBS criteria, don't prescribe Oral Nutritional Supplements (ONS) – even if a health professional requests the prescription.

- Patients who do not meet ACBS criteria still tend to have an underlying issue affecting appetite/oral intake/ability to buy & prepare food – e.g. depression, elderly & no longer able to manage shopping & cooking, substance misuse (see also Appendix – Substance Misusers), other social & financial issues – can any of these issues be helped, either as below or via referral to other services? (See also Appendix – Useful Contacts)

- There are Over The Counter (OTC) nutritional supplements that can be purchased from supermarkets and pharmacies/online pharmacies. If the patient/carers are able to purchase these, recommend <u>bd</u> as below.
