

Trans-anal Irrigation System* Pathway

CNWL-MK Continence service

Referral letter from GP must outline the clinical diagnosis/bowel problem and include the bowel assessment documentation and results/outcome of investigations, examinations or treatment

Patient will receive a continence clinic appointment for full bowel assessment following NICE CG49 and Royal College of Surgeons, 2014 Faecal Incontinence guidance; Or a District Nurse referral if patient is housebound, with support from Continence Service; Assessment to include patient completed food diary, bowel diary, quality of life questionnaire and ******DRE. If following the assessment, more conservative/less invasive treatment options seem viable these will be explored in the first instance prior to discussion/trial of trans-anal irrigation procedure.
