

How to use the Turbohaler



"Twist"

- 1. Unscrew and lift off the **protective cover** of the Turbohaler
- 2. Hold the Turbohaler upright. **Twist** the coloured base grip as far as it will go in one direction and then **twist** it back. **You should hear a click.** This makes it ready to inhale and moves the counter on. (When you start a new Turbohaler repeat this step for the **first dose only** (i.e. 2 clicks))

"Breathe"

- 3. **Breathe out** gently away from the Turbohaler (to make room in your lungs to breathe in deeply). Put the mouthpiece between your lips and teeth and form a seal (do not chew or bite on the mouthpiece)
- 4. Breathe in as deeply and as hard as you can through your mouth to fill your lungs (you will need to breathe in faster than with a Metered Dose Inhaler (MDI)). Even when a full dose is taken there may be no taste
- 5. Remove the Turbohaler from your mouth and **hold your breath** for up to 10 seconds (to allow the drug to settle in your lungs)
- 6. **Breathe out slowly** (do not breathe out into the Turbohaler)

"Repeat"

- 7. Wait for 30 seconds before repeating steps 2 6 if you require a second dose
- 8. Replace the protective cover

A red line appears in the window on the side of the Turbohaler when there are 20 doses left.

Breathe in deeply!
